

'Working with families' workshop

This is a 4 hour work shop and has been designed (and is delivered) by family carers of people with learning disabilities

Who is it for?:

- Professionals working in Health, Social Care and Education,
- Support Providers (e.g.Staff teams in Supported living or other services)

The workshop can be adapted to fit requirements of different professionals across a range of services and agencies.

The Purpose: to ensure professionals in a wide range of roles, work in a way that enhances relationships with families. To share some simple practices and create a shared understanding that opens the way to good communication and cooperation between professionals and the families they work with.

It includes:

- > Some basic facts about family carers
- Understanding the family journey
- The impact of this journey on families and implications for staff/professionals working with them
- What's important to /for families
- > The importance of good communication.
- > Do's and don'ts when working with families
- Negative reputations
- Families as 'allies on the ground'

What does it cost? - £700.00 - for a Maximum of 20 participants – includes handouts and refreshments (participants are asked to provide their own lunch)
