In Oxfordshire there is a review every time someone with a Learning Disability dies.



The group of people who review deaths include:



- People with lived experience of learning disability. At the moment this is through Oxfordshire Family Support Network.
- People who run services for people with learning disabilities.
- Commissioners, who buy services for people with learning disabilities.



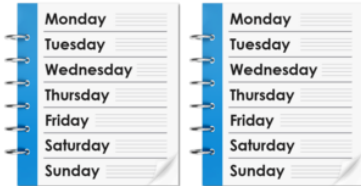
Anyone can report the death of someone with a learning disability on the internet [LeDeR notification link](#) .



Families and carers are asked for their view of what happened before the person they cared for died.



By talking to everyone involved in the person's care, services can learn how to improve.



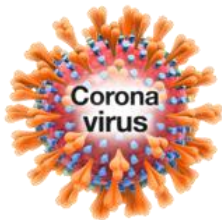
During the COVID -19 pandemic the reviews have happened within 2 weeks of any death.



The reviews show:



- So far in **2020** there **has not been an increase** in numbers of **notified deaths** of people with a **learning disability**.
- **All** of the people with a **learning disability** who had **COVID 19** had **full care plans** and **access to specialist treatments**.
- There has been **good care planning** to **help** people to **go home** with **extra support** if **needed**.
